The Centre for Adult Education (CAE) provide a range of alternative and flexible education programs for young people including New Pathways Re Connect which is a tailored program for disadvantaged young people and provides mentoring, challenge activities, accredited training and personal support to assist early school leavers re-engage in education – students complete GCE and pathway into other programs.

STREAT	Youth aged 15 to 25	STREAT was started in 2009 in the City of Melbourne aiming to raise awareness and assist people experiencing homelessness. When STREAT kick-started, it offered a six-month Certificate II program to its young people. This has now evolved into a suite of programs including hospitality short courses, a Certificate II program, work experience opportunities and a creative arts program. With the support of an Educator and a Youth Worker in every classroom, the Hester Hornbrook Academy aims to reconnect disengaged young people through a combination of learning and wellbeing support, through a curriculum which is flexible and tailored to each individual's interests and goals. The practical education programs are project-based and connected to real world employment skills.
